

UNCLE BILL and BILL'S WAY

Born in Kalgoorlie WA on 01 March 1926 and was christened William Gray RITCHIE but was known as and went by "Bill" as was preferred by his mother. Had a brother Harry and Sister Jan.

About the age of 9-10 he wanted to be a sailor. When WW II broke out, he was too young to join but when 18 applied to join. His birth certificate had Bill having to change his name on the birth certificate so to be able to join the RAN.

Naval Reserve Time

William Gray Ritchie and was finally accepted at the age of 20, joining the RAN on 25 July 1944 as Reservist with Fremantle Division. A mate suggested that they become radar ratings. Training at RAN Station 284 now known as HMAS Watson on 6 Jan 1945.

His first ship was HMAS Yandra (FY91) (b) a merchant vessel being used a coastal patrol craft on 12 March 1945. The ship was about to sail in darkness and was sent to the crow's nest as lookout. Found himself a aloft in a wet, windy, and rough sea. Then followed postings to HMAS Penguin, Moreton before a posting to HMAS Gerard (FY62) an examination and stores carrier. Then followed posting to HMAS Broome, Bathurst, and Platypus, Lonsdale, and Watson. Then transferring to the permanent service on 31 May 1946.

Permanent Service.

Service at HMAS Rushcutter (Watson), HMAS Murchinson, and HMAS Bataan. HMAS Penguin then HMAS Albatross before joining HMAS Sydney (III) 16 July 1949. Serving in Korea waters until posted to HMAS Watson in October 1952, then joined HMAS Vengeance on 01 September 1953 and returning her back to the UK. Commenced Special Duties training at HMS Dryad 6 Aug 1955 then HMS Tumult and HMS Sheffield.

During his "Knife & Fork" course (said to be the course that teaches sailors how to become officers) Bill was exposed to numerous RN traditions, many of which he followed throughout his career, but some he dropped as being, in his mind, too outrageous. Posted to the then RN flagship HMS SHEFFIELD, Bill took a leaf out of his traditional training and joined the ship in full uniform, complete with sword and medals. This caused a small stir as the gangway staff confused his approach as one of the Officer of the Guard and the Executive Officer of SHEFFIELD was not pleased. (the tradition of joining in this manner had almost ceased and, today, is no longer practiced but Bill was received as having joined correctly, as was Bill's way).

Shortly after settling in Bill was called to the Executive Officer who gave Bill the task of writing up the ship's seamanship procedures – the original book having been lost during the refit from which the ship was emerging. He was given eleven days to complete the task. Having specialised in Radar, Bill was short on experience but wisely visited other ships in the dockyard and, on the eleventh day, passed the completed document to the Executive Officer. Two days later Bill was again called by the Executive Officer who opened the discussion with, "I hate Australians! Bill, of course asked "Why?" only to be told that he had 'shown up' other junior officers by the way he had joined the ship and then held up Bill's book shaking it at Bill. Bill was somewhat taken aback and asked if there was a problem with the book only to be told, by the XO, that he had been unable to dot an 'i' or cross a 't'. Bill's reply was, "But Sir, I did tell you that although I spoke Australian, I could also read and understand English." Conversation ended with the XO still muttering, "I hate Australians!"! Bill's work in the ship continued in Bill's way.

Return to Australia 1959 then served at HMAS Watson and Albatross until going back to the UK for further training in 1961 Served in HMS Ark Royal from 07 January 1963 then at HMS Heron (The RN largest Naval Air Station also known as RNAS Yeovilton. from 13 Dec 1963 until late 1964 returning to Australia. Served in HMAS Melbourne from 15 Feb till 07 Oct 1965 joining HMAS Stuart.

Then a cycle of postings between Watson and Stuart. (Possibly OIC of the Air Control School) Then short posting to HMAS Sydney on 20 Nov 1967, back to Watson in Nov 1967. Transited via HMAS Tarangau to join HMAS Perth on her return from her first deployment to Sth Vietnam. Briefly at Watson 10 April 1968 then joined Perth for 2nd deployment to Vietnam on17 June 1968.

Back again to Watson briefly in May 1969 before joining Melbourne on 1 Sep 1969 as Mate of the Upper Deck and D1.

Navy Office called in Dec 1970 until rejoining Melbourne on 8 Apr 1974. He was the OOD on Christmas Eve when Cyclone Tracy struck Darwin. He served as Melbourne Disaster Co-ordinator assisting in setting a Shore Command to co-ordinate the various ships working parties during Navy Assist to Darwin. In April 1975 posted back to HMAS Watson as the Training Officer and OIC of the ND school. The Ritchie Building is named in honour of his service. Posted back to Navy Office on 15 Dec 1975 and being promoted to Commander. Continuing in the training role as the deputy Director of Naval Training. Retired In his final Naval years, Bill had two very professional and rewarding tasks.

First was his time as the Executive Officer of HMAS STIRLING and his role in the preparation and commissioning of the Base much of which is now common knowledge. The second was that of being the Deputy Commander at the joint RAN / USN Naval Communication Station, HAROLD E HOLT, in Exmouth Western Australia. Bundegi Reef, a natural reef in the Gulf. During his time in Exmouth tourism was increasing exponentially and the town's population expanding rapidly. Bundegi Reef, which by now had become a prime "BCFing" site for Exmouth, could only be accessed by a lengthy, badly constructed, and poorly serviced bush track. The local population was now regularly attempting to force a track from the nearby VLF station to Bundegi reef through the salt water well field – a potentially disastrous situation.

With his thinking cap on, in his own inimitable way, convinced the RAN, the USN, the Australian and American security organisations, Federal and State governments and, of course, the Exmouth local government that a sealed road to, and parking area at, Bundegi Reef would greatly reduce any untoward accident in the salt water well field, and would likely benefit Exmouth in particular, and the WA tourist organisation in general. And so, it came to pass, although he had left Exmouth by then, that a sealed road, including a large parking area, was delivered to Bundegi Reef. Now called "**Bill's Way**".

After leaving the Navy in 1983 (e) Interview with Matilda Price 23 April 2013.

He remembers his service time as though it was yesterday.

While still serving, he met his wife, Joan, the couple was married for 56 years before she died.

They had three sons Tony, Peter, Walter and a daughter Anne, three of whom work at Garden Island, and has 10 granddaughters and a grandson.

Before retiring, Mr Ritchie was made a Member of the Order of Australia for his service to the Navy, particularly at HMAS Stirling. When he retired in 1983 it was the first chance, he had to live a normal life.

One of his biggest achievements since leaving the navy has been setting up and operating the Rockingham Tourist Information Centre as a volunteer. He was even made a life member of the Rockingham and Districts Tour Authority.

"Anzac Day means a lot to me,"

"I remember all the friends I've had and those who have died, and particularly having served in HMAS Perth and HMAS Sydney I am very associated with those ship organisations and their history."

He said it was also important to him because his father was involved in the first landing at Gallipoli as a medic. As well as his Anzac Day commitments, Mr Ritchie also attends the HMAS Perth and HMAS Sydney memorial services each year. Other Naval organisation are the Fleet Air Arm Association, and the Naval Association of Australia. Served on the HMAS PERTH Assoc WA Chapter as Treasurer (Bill) and Secretary from its inception in 1991. Held the positions for about 20 years.





Khameleon Tsunami by Mike Fry



Grand Prix - HMAS Melbourne RIMPAC '78

I was strolling through Pearl Harbor Naval Base with POUW Rusty Ward when a Pontiac Grand Prix drives past. Upon noticing the badge on the car's boot Rusty exclaims "aha, grand pricks, must be an officer's car"!

Pay Day - HMAS Hobart '81

ABQMG Brian Zubrinick (AKA Zubes) was the quintessential pig-pen. One of those sailors that you could dress up like a troubadour and five minutes later he would look like a stevedore. His pockets would always appear poking out from the bottom of his shorts weighted down with maccas and he was invariably adrift for everything. Despite these apparent shortcomings, Zubes displayed a pleasant demeanour and his mild manner was appreciated by the entire crew. As his surname would suggest, Zubes was always at the end of the line when falling in alphabetically, something he would often complain about. One such occasion happened to be a payday in the middle of the IO. When the Junior Sailors were assembled three deep in the pay-line on Mount 52 deck, the Chief Coxswain, in one of his rare gestures of kindness, ordered "about-turn" to enable Zubes to be paid first. Unfortunately for Zubes, this was yet another occasion when he was late and had to join the end of the line. Result - Zubes was still the last to get paid.

Ship's Head - HMAS Hobart '81



ABQMG Geddes was an excellent Elvis impersonator who maintained his Elvis outfit as part of his steaming kit.

While overseas, we would invariably locate him appearing at some venue performing his Elvis act. Unfortunately, he was blessed with an unusually large head. One day while manoeuvring the ship in a tranquil North Arabian Sea, the OOW ordered the Helmsman to "call ship's head". Upon overhearing this instruction, the QM immediately picked up 1MC (main broadcast) and made the pipe "Able Seaman Geddes, bridge".

DODGER GOES RN

Venue - RN Warship somewhere in the South China Sea in the mid 90's.

While working for me at the ASAC School, the then PORPAC Dodger Long was sent to the Five Power Defence Agreement (FPDA) Exercise STARFISH to perform Strike Safety duties embarked in a RN war canoe. Upon returning to Oz, his tales of the time spent aboard centred on meals. Chips with every meal and unidentified meals except for the chips. During one such meal, he confronted the Chef while scraping his dinner into the bin and declared "We'll call it a draw then shall we". "A draw" the Chef asked? "Yes" said Dodger, "you couldn't cook it and I couldn't eat it."

SHEEPSHEAD FRONTS THE TABLE

As the duty Leading Hand at WATSON is the early 70's, it was my duty to ensure that the Junior Sailor's bar was shut by 2200. Upon clearing the mess, I noticed a raging argument on the other side of the bar between Lex (the civilian bar manager) and the then LSRP Bob McCloud (AKA Sheepshead) who worked behind the bar. Next day I discover that Lex had run Sheepshead in and that I had been summoned to attend the table as the only witness. So I front up and when questioned by the Chief Coxswain as to what I witnessed, I replied "that I saw Lex and Sheepshead...". That's when the proceedings halted, the CMDR looked at the COXN who looked back at the CMDR, then they both looked at me and said "who's Sheepshead". I relied "he is" pointing to LS McCloud.
